The aims of The Vikings! (NFPS) are to bring both these aspects of tenth century Britain to life - to present audiences with a living slice of history.

Wherever possible, scripts are based around recorded historical events which occured in the region in which the show is to take place. With both living history and battle displays fully integrated, this extra educational dimension greatly adds to the enjoyment of the spectators - audiences find out WHV the battle(s) occured and learn something about Dark Age life and culture in the process.

Each item of gear that we use is carefully researched and based on a historical example from our period. Not only the clothing, footwear, armour and weapons, but also the cooking utensils, tents and craft tools used in living history displays.
