# To the Men & Women of the Raven, Greetings.

13<sup>th</sup> May 2002

Hello Everyone,

#### Morden Park.

As I write, it is Tuesday morning after the Morden show and I am completely knackered. Three performances a day for three days, by the last fight I could barely lift my shield! When Mo, Steve and I first arrived it appeared that we were at the set for "Stalagluffte 13", in previous years the re-enactors hired for this event had been blamed for steeling from the traders and we were fenced off from them. Security guards with dogs prevented us from escaping.

After this poor start thing did improve, the Konungr explained the facts of life to the show organisers and our own behaviour showed that we were not as unreliable as other re-enactors. The weather was generally ok, the only serious rain was from midnight Sunday until mid morning Monday when it turned into a nice bright day. Manaraefan was deployed on the left flank of the Saxon army next to the audience, we had to show fight every day which made the work even harder. The Manaraefan warriors and those attached to us did a grand job.

As I was leading the unit I also had to go out for the parleys and shout at Black Bob, sometimes all I could do was breath heavily at him. With the audience only on one side we could get close to them and do a little audience participation. It was hard to get them to cheer for either Edmund Ironside or Cnut on the first two days, but the Monday audience, as well as being bigger responded better.

We were heavily involved with the Kiddie Vike as usual, me on the PA, Steve beating the kids into some sort of order and the rest facing the awful charge of the screaming kids. The villagers and marshals had to come to our rescue on Monday, when we had so many children taking part that the warriors had to face four separate groups of kids. Sandra, Sara and others had to keep the waiting kids in line and then help to arm them quickly, from where I was standing it didn't look like an easy task.

The LHE was busy, especially on Monday, most kids seemed to think that we were trying to sell our helmets! Constant vigilance was required to prevent theft, even so Simone had some of her beads stolen by a pint sized snatch and run artist on Sunday.

Mo and Maria did a fine job as Manaraefan standard bearers and Mo and Simon made valiant efforts to die near my corpse! I think I would have preferred them to sacrifice themselves to keep me alive! At the end of the weekend the honours were even between the two sides in the free fights so everyone went home happy. The only combat problem we had was that anyone who turned up late joined the Viking side (well we are The Vikings), this meant that every time we went on the field for the Saxons we were outnumbered, quite heavily at times. On Sunday some Vikings had to defect to our side to prevent us from being crushed at the start. Most of our warriors

wore mail so we made a good visual impression, at least it made sense when we ignored some hits!

Overall it was a fun event, there were three short processions each day, they were not hard, just inconvenient. Provided that the organisers treat us better I would go again.

### **Basing House 21-23 June**

The site will be open from Lunchtime on Thursday 20th of June. Please enter the site via the gate in the British Legion car park (see map) and find a member of Armada Militia, who will then direct you from there.

There is space for both authentic and "modern camping" although it might be necessary for people wishing to camp authentically to carry some of their equipment as vehicle access to parts of the site is restricted.

### **Friday**

There will be a short briefing at about 8.45am on Friday morning for those people involved in the schools day; we currently have approximately 400 children booked to attend during the day. The first group is booked for 9.30am although they might appear earlier depending on their transport! It is our intention to provide some food at lunchtime for all of the participants and we are hoping to do some sort of vegetable soup at the end of the day. It is hoped that the schoolchildren should be clear of the site by about 3.30pm and although the site is technically open to the public until 6pm we are off duty as soon as the children have left

### **Saturday and Sunday**

Basing House is a civilised venue and consequently not open to the public in the morning. Therefore the weekend event will take place between 2pm to 6pm. The format will be relaxed living history in your campsite and possibly a short arena display (we will sort this out on the weekend).

It is possible to have fires but they must be raised off the ground and on metal plates, you will also need to bring some of your own firewood although there was some on site last time I was there. Also please be aware it is an archaeological site when using very large tent pegs.

You can now ignore the warning on the map about the local pub being re-enactor unfriendly as it has just changed landlords and there appears to be a new policy on this.

Finally the immediate locals are somewhat unfriendly and the curator would appreciate it if we could keep the noise at a reasonable level in the evenings so as to minimise the complaints from the neighbours.

### **Helmets; Fittings & Decoration**

Following a recent authenticity incident where Roger, Mo & I (Dave) were pulled up on our helm fittings; I have done a little digging, and herein paraphrase the main points of the specific gear guide on the subject so we don't get caught again!

I have confined my comments to domed and conical helms as nobody within Manaraefan as far as I am aware uses a chimney helm. If anyone wishes more information on the subject, I have a copy of the specific gear guide available. It is very detailed, and is worth a look before embarking on any work in this area.

Generally speaking, both types of helmet may have a nasal, which is either part of the main body, or, is fitted as a separate item. It is thought that conical helms are more likely to have a "built-in" nasal than those of domed construction. If the nasal is a separate fitting then it may also incorporate eyebrows.

Another possibility is the spectacle guard, but again, this is thought to be more common to the domed rather than the conical helm. This does not however preclude the use of spectacles on a conical helm.

Now the important bit; no evidence exists for decoration to be applied directly to the body of the helm, or for the use of bronze or pewter cast fittings.

Helmet fittings are made of iron, and it is to these fittings that any artwork is applied. This may take the form of precious metal foils or plates bonded to the surface, or in some cases inlaid wire, chased and contrasted with black niello. The decoration ranges from simple lines, to complex knot work and religious symbols.

Helmets may also be fitted with a ring mail aventail or rigid strip to provide neck protection.

I'm not suggesting that anyone needs to panic right now, but if you are thinking of a new lid or refurbishing the one you have, please take heed.
