We have just completed our first show of the year at the North Somerset Museum, Weston-Super-Mare. Hrothgar "Bokraeder" Gilthorsson

DOB:

957

Place of birth: Skolmor, Denmark

Fought for Harald Gormsson, King of Denmark in 973. Became a Christian and warrior of the Emperor Otto in Shipwrecked while crossing the English Channel and recanted Christianity in 984. Joined the Herred of the Host led by Jarl Thorgier Havarsson Coalbrowskald in 985. Married Muirigan Legbiter in 986. Made Huscarl to Jarl Thorgier 987. His son Thorfinn was born in 988. Fought at the Battle of Maldon in 991. Made Jarl of the High Council by Konungr Hrafn the Red in 992 with the responsibility of preparing the Host for battle. Fell out with Jarl Thorgier in 994 and with Halgerd Eiricsdotta, Belly-Shaker, Guthrothr Valgard Toebreaker and Astrid founded the Herred Manaraefan. Made Battle Captain of the Host by Konungr Thorgrim Sigmundsson in 997 and in 1002 became Thorgrim's right hand and chief advisor. In the same year Hrothgar became leader of the Manaraefan succeeding Guthrothr Belly-shaker Kormac the Carter.

Hrothgar's favourite weapon is the bow and he is greatly feared and respected by friend and foe alike when using it, in 1002 he shot down the leader of an enemy army so disheartening the foe that the Host drove them from the field. As well as with sword and shield he is also skilled in the use of the long axe, spear and javelin.

Hrothgar is played by Roger Barry, he is a soldier and lives in Salisbury.
